

Cache Mosquito Abatement District Board of Trustees

The Cache Mosquito Abatement District (CMAD) Board of Trustees met for a regular meeting on Wednesday, December 17, 2014, at 7:00 pm in the Bear River Environmental Health Department conference room (85 E 1800 N, North Logan). Representatives from 13 municipalities were present:

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Elaine Nelson. The agenda was reviewed. Scott Larsen moved, and Joe Hansen seconded, the agenda be adopted. MINUTES

The minutes of the November 12, 2014 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

Tom LaBau moved, and Darwin Pitcher seconded, that the minutes be approved as amended. Ayes: Wood, Godfrey, Hansen, Gatherum, LaBau, Pitcher, Jepsen, Price, Rigby, Larsen, Nelson, Johnson, Mather, and Spackman. Nays: none. Motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING – 2015 BUDGET

Tom LaBau moved and Joes Hansen seconded that the regular meeting be closed and the public hearing on the proposed 2015 budget be opened. No public was present; the public hearing was closed and the regular meeting resumed.

2015 BUDGET (RESOLUTION 2014-04)

Scott Larsen moved and Joe Hansen seconded to adopt the 2015 budget with Resolution 2014-04. Ayes: Wood, Godfrey, Hansen, Gatherum, LaBau, Pitcher, Jepsen, Price, Rigby, Larsen, Nelson, Johnson, Mather, and Spackman. Nays: none. Motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING – OPEN 2014 BUDGET

Perry Spackman moved and Tom LaBau seconded to open the public hearing on opening the 2014 budget to make necessary adjustments. No public was present; the public hearing was closed and the regular meeting resumed.

OPEN 2014 BUDGET

Scott Larsen moved and Dave Wood seconded to adopt Resolution 2014-05, Adjustments to the 2014 Budget. Ayes: Wood, Godfrey, Hansen, Gatherum, LaBau, Pitcher, Jepsen, Price, Rigby, Larsen, Nelson, Johnson, Mather, and Spackman. Nays: none. Motion passed unanimously.

MANAGERS REPORTS

Richard Rigby reported that the procurement policy continues to be a main topic at the UMAA (Utah Mosquito Abatement Association) directors meetings. Discussion was held on purchasing a forklift vs. a skidsteer. Richard is still able to borrow the forklift from the business next door to move the pallets of pesticide. Kermit wants the District to not have to borrow equipment such as that, primarily due to liability concerns. He told the Board about a person who buys and refurbishes forklifts and gave the contact information to Richard. A forklift is needed for off-pavement use.

Terrie Wierenga summarized the differences between the current CMAD purchasing policy and 84-page template from UASD. The current policy is very broad while UASD's policy covers definitions, surplus procedures, and contract processes. The area most lacking in the current policy deals with design-construction-purchase of real property. There are parts of the CMAD policy that need to be expanded to cover the new requirements (construction projects and professional services) but few additional topics are needed. The Board discussed the options and decided to expand/revise the current policy rather than adopt the UASD template. Terrie distributed the dates for the 2015 meetings. She's only heard from two cities that need to appoint trustees for terms beginning in January 2015. Joe Hansen said he was reappointed for Cornish.

CONTINUING DISCUSSION – PROPERTY AND BUILDING

Deon Johnson told the Board about some land in Benson that might work. Power is there and septic would be needed. Gas is close to there, too.

BILLS

RESOLUTION 2014-04
ADOPTION OF THE CMAD 2015 BUDGET

The Cache Mosquito Abatement District (CMAD) Board of Trustees in a regular meeting, lawful notice of which had been given, finds that a public hearing was held on December 17, 2014 upon lawful notice, and that it is necessary and statutorily required that a budget be adopted for CMAD for the Fiscal Year 2015.

THEREFORE, the Cache Mosquito Abatement District Board of Trustees hereby adopts the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that the 2015 Cache Mosquito Abatement District General Fund budget in the total amount of Two hundred ninety thousand three hundred dollars (\$290,000) and a Capital Projects Fund budget in the total amount of Four hundred one thousand five hundred seventy-three dollars (\$401,573), the original of which is on file in the office of the Cache Mosquito Abatement District Board of Trustees and a copy of which is attached to this original, is hereby adopted for the Fiscal Year 2015 beginning January 1, 2015 and ending on December 31, 2015.

This resolution was adopted by unanimous vote of the Cache Mosquito Abatement District Board of Trustees on the 17th day of December, 2014.
